#### REGISTRATION

Registration will be held via <u>Uplifter on the Skate Canada PEI website</u> for PEI skaters will open on *January 18, 2025*, and for skaters from other provinces on *January 20, 2025*. The final deadline for all registrations is *January 25, 2025*.

**Important** – This competition is held in alignment with the PEI STARSkate Championships and therefore a skater cannot skate in the same discipline at both competitions.

#### **REGISTRATION FEES**

All fees to be paid via Uplifter.

STAR 1 Element Assessment\$40.00STAR 2 and 3 Free Skate Program\$50.00Team Events\$40.00Late Fee: \$25 for late registration or submissions.

#### **REFUND POLICY**

After registration ends, refunds are only for medical reasons with a doctor's note.

#### **ACCREDITATION FOR COACHES**

Coaches must meet the following accreditation standards:

- be a current professional coaching member in Good Standing with Skate Canada
- hold a Regional in-training certification or higher







## MUSIC / PPC

All programs (STAR 2 and 3) must be skated to music. Programs are to be skated in harmony with the music chosen by the competitor. Music for all disciplines may contain vocals.

The competitors are required to submit all music by *February 1, 2025*, through your Uplifter account on the Skate Canada PEI website.

Clubs/Coaches must bring a digital device with all the music for their skaters to the competitive venue as a back-up option.

#### AWARDS

For Star 1-3 events - Ribbons will be provided based on the standard achieved. Award presentations will take place following the team events and again at the end of the day.

# GENERAL REGULATIONS

## ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

- (1) Be **Skate Canada registrants** in good standing.
- (2) **TEST AND AGE PRE-REQUISITES:** Competitors shall meet the <u>test requirements</u> to compete before *October 1* preceding the competition.
- (3) Skaters may skate up if desired. However, skaters can only compete in one level per event.

#### EVENTS TO BE HELD

The following events will be offered:

# (1) FREE SKATE EVENTS

The following sections contain ONLY the specifications and eligibility requirements. For specific technical information please refer to the 2024-25 STAR Program Requirements Guide on the <u>Skate Canada PEI website</u>.

## (a) STAR 1 Element Assessment

May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 freeskate assessment. Elements assessed to standard. A DRAW for Circle Stroking exercise will be made for each group at ice level.

#### (b) STAR 2 Free Skate Program

May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 freeskate assessment. One program of a maximum 2:10 minutes in length.

#### (c) STAR 3 Free Skate Program

May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 freeskate assessment. One program of 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds).

# (2) TEAM EVENTS

Entry MUST be consistent with the skaters' registered FreeSkate Event, may skate up one level if they choose.

Teams will consist of 2-4 skaters, more than 50% of skaters must have passed the required test for entry. Each skater will perform one element. If a team consists of less than 4 skaters, no skater may perform more than 2 elements. (A skater cannot skate for 2 different teams at the same competition). Elements will be skated in the order listed. The first element will be performed by every team in the event before the second element is performed, and so on. Each element may only be attempted once. (\*Please refer to Skate Canada for specific technical requirements\*)





# (a) STAR 2 TEAM

- Loop Jump
- Waltz/Toe-Loop Combination
- Backward Upright Spin
- Forward Spiral Sequence\*

## (b) STAR 3 TEAM

- Flip Jump
- Loop/Loop Combination
- Combination Spin\*
- Forward Spiral Sequence\*

\*Backward Upright Spin STAR 2 Minimum of 3 revs

\*Forward Spiral Sequence STAR 2 Two forward spirals, one on each foot performed on either an outside or inside edges. No more than eight steps between. Both spirals must be unassisted.

\*Forward Spiral Sequence STAR 3 Two forward spirals, one on each foot performed on either an outside or inside edges. No more than four steps between. Both spirals must be unassisted.

\*Combination Spin STAR 3 Must include at least one camel position and one sit position and may include change of foot. Forward entry only. No flying entry or difficult variations. Combination Spin – minimum of 4 revs Change Combination Spin – minimum of 3/3 revs.
